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Last fall, a much anticipated exhibit was unveiled at the George Bush Presidential Library and Museum. For the past few months, The Culture of Wine exhibit has been unraveling the mystery, magic, and making of wine.

Through the planting process, harvest, and fermentation, visitors are able to see each step of the process illustrated through life-size murals, vines, and actual equipment used in the winemaking process. The presidential tie-in comes in the form of a reproduced Monticello dining room which serves as a testimony to wine's influence on Thomas Jefferson and, by connection, to the American presidency.

As part of the exhibit's grand opening, George Taber spoke about his book Judgment of Paris: California vs. France and the Historic 1976 Paris Tasting That Revolutionized Wine. This historic blind tasting judged a selection of California wines as better than their French counterparts, a verdict that catalyzed the American wine industry.

The exhibit will remain open through August 22, 2010, in the Ansary Gallery of American History at the George Bush Presidential Library and Museum in College Station, Texas.
